# FACULTY INTERNATIONAL VISITS

GEORGIA - Dr. Lisa Gibson, professor of International Relations and Development, was hosted by Caucasus University. She participated in the courses of "Eastern Enlargement of the EU" and "International Organizations." Dr. Gibson also delivered an open seminar: "From Terrorism to Triumph: How personal loss can be a platform for global peacemaking."

# THE CENTER FOR DIALOGUE AND CONFLICT TRANSFORMATION

**LEBANON** - Raffi Feghali, a storytelling peacebuilding performer, presented a monodramatic storytelling performance titled "Anatomy of a Home." The LCC community was transported into his Lebanese world, embarking on a journey in search of identity and belonging.

GHANA - Prince Agyei, a visiting professor, had an impactful visit to LCC. His research concentrates on intractable communal conflicts, with a specific focus on the South and the Nkonya- Alavanyo conflict in Ghana. Prince explored the potential of a transformative approach in building relationships, diminishing violence, and advancing justice. His presence brought a distinct African perspective to the field of conflict transformation.

NORTHERN IRELAND - Peace facilitators, Colin and Rachel Craig, along with Michael Gibbs delivered a series of workshops in facilitator training, focusing on navigating conflict and change using the framework of the Dialogue for Peaceful Change methodology.

UKRAINE - Dr. Julia Buyskykh, a scholar from Kyiv, shared her long-term research on pilgrimages at the Polish-Ukraine border. Her presentation titled "Borders, Bridges and Belonging: When Religion Heals Intergenerational Memories and Trauma" offered professors and students an opportunity to better understand how peace is built.

# STANDING WITH **UKRAINE**

LCC was among the first to see the documentary FREEDOM ON FIRE and have an exclusive discussion with Director Evgeny Afineevsky. This powerful documentary highlights the 9 years of war in Ukraine, beginning in 2014 through February 6, 2023.

The "Unissued Diplomas" exhibition project was held at LCC, uncovering the stories of 36 students living in Ukraine who were killed in the war.

This year's Christmas Market featured local musical talent, including the Ukrainian community. It was a great evening that also helped collect donations for the Ukrainian school in Klaipėda.

LCC was honored to host the Director of all Ukrainian schools around Europe (39 schools in 15 countries). We look forward to our collaboration as a way to support Ukrainian students who have fled their country because of the Russian invasion.









# BUILDING BRIDGES FOR WAR-AFFECTED STUDENTS

In November 2022, the LCC Middle East Scholars program was identified by UNHCR, the UN Refugee Agency, as the "targeted admission program that most closely implements several core components of education pathways for refugees."

- JAPAN Aiste Motekaitienė was invited by the Global Taskforce on Third Country Education Pathways to speak at the Expanding Refugee Education Pathways conference in Japan. Fifty people from 20 different countries gathered to share their experiences in building and running educational pathway programs for refugees.
- IRAQ Aiste Motekaitiene and 3rd year student leva Rūkė met with government agencies, NGOs, and LCC alumni. They discussed future cooperation, capacity building for the region and new projects in the field of peace and conflict resolution.
- **SWEDEN** LCC hosted guests from Vinga Folkhögskola, a vocational school that works with refugees who are building a new life in Sweden. LCC looks forward to future cooperation.
