# THE CENTER FOR FAITH AND HUMAN FLOURISHING (CFHF)

Established in fall 2017, with the leadership of Dr.
Benjamin Giffone, the CFHF supports research that seeks fuller understanding of the movement of individuals and communities from "languishing" to "surviving" to "flourishing," with a particular interest in the role of Christian faith as motivation for the pursuit of flourishing, and as a means for individuals and communities to flourish.



# MA PROGRAM IN THE INTERNATIONAL MANAGEMENT

The Master's program in International Management was affirmed through a rigorous reaccreditation process. Both of our graduate programs – the MA in TESOL an MA in International Management – continue to gain visibility on campus raising the academic bar for scholarship and learning within our LCC community.



# CORE CURRICULUM REVIEW

The review and revision of LCC's Christian Liberal Art Core Curriculum made excellent progress, with nearly all fulltime LCC faculty participating in the process. The new core curriculum will expand the breadth of liberal arts and sciences offerings, and will increase opportunities for students to choose classes that best match their individual goals and interests.



# BASKETBALL TEAM VISITS CHINA

In December 2017 the Moose basketball team placed second in their first tournament in China. The basketball team had two tournaments and six games during their visit. #### "LEAN IN" SCHOLARSHIP

In April, inspired by reading Sheryl Sandberg's book Lean In, five LCC female students from Lithuania, Albania, Ukraine, and Kosovo launched their fundraising project. Their goal is working towards a sustainable scholarship fund which will cover the tuition of female leader in need who wants to pursue her education at LCC.



#### **EUROPEAN CHAMPION**

LCC first year student Skaistė Venckutė came back from the European Kyokushin Championship with the gold medal, and the title of the best European Championship Female Fighter. The President of Lithuanian, Dalia Grybauskaitė, met Skaiste and other Karate Championship participants, congratulating them on their exceptional performance, with gratitude for promoting Lithuania's name abroad.



# BASKETBALL ACHIEVEMENTS

LCC basketball head coach Marius Tamolis was honored at the Lithuanian Student Sport Association annual ceremony as the assistant coach of the Lithuanian gold medal team in the World University Games. Valentinas Mitalauskas, LCC 4th year student, was honored as the LCC Sportsman of the Year.



#### LCC BUSINESS TEAM

In October, LCC Business students won 3rd place in the CREATIVE SHOCK 2017 Global Social Business Case Competition which included 1224 students from 403 universities in 100 countries around the globe. Every year participants gather to solve real life business, marketing, and PR problems for social enterprises and organizations.

#### ROTARACT

In February, the Rotary Clubs of the Klaipėda region welcomed a new club, the International Rotaract Club of Klaipėda, based at LCC. The club consists primarily of LCC students representing 10 countries with our senior student from Macedonia, Sara Pavlova, as the president.



#### CENTENNIAL GROVE PROJECT

In April, 50 trees were planted on the LCC campus as a part of the Centennial Grove project that was initiated by LCC student Jonas Preisaitis, 25 different Rotary community clubs, 22 regional organizations, associations, businesses, and 21 different families organized, supported and volunteered at the event. The initiative served symbolic gesture to mark the 100th anniversary of Lithuanian Independence and the 50th anniversary of Rotaract.

# PUBLIC SPEAKING COMPETITIONS

Through interactive activities, presentations and small group discussions, participants confronted stereotypes in their own lives and within Lithuania. # STAFF AND FACULTY PARTICIPATE IN EXCHANGE PROGRAMS

During this year 11 LCC staff and faculty members participated in Erasmus exchange programs which took them to Estonia, France, Finland, Ireland, Netherlands, Armenia and Indonesia. The Center for International Education (CIE) Program Coordinator participated in the Erasmus+ staff training and had the opportunity to visit three partner universities in South Korea (Handong Global University, Sejong University and Kyung Hee University).

# SALTSHAKER YOUTH CONFERENCE


This year Saltshaker marked its 15th anniversary and had over 200 participants. The theme of the conference was "3C's Charge, Connect, Call."

#### KIDS CAMP IN VILNIUS






# FACILITIES RENOVATION FUNDING
